

PassMark Software Recommendations

Recommended Operating Systems:

Recommended Browsers / Versions:

Microsoft Internet Explorer v6 through v7
Mozilla Firefox v1.5 and v2.0
Apple Safari v2.0

Enabling Browser Cookies

For PassMark to work properly, a user's Web browser must be configured to accept cookies from the PassMark server. Following are procedures for enabling these cookies in each of the recommended Web browsers.

Internet Explorer

To allow PassMark server cookies in Internet Explorer v 6.0 and v7.0:

1. On the menu bar, open the **Tools** menu.
2. Select **Internet Options**. The Internet Options dialog box appears.
3. Click the Security tab.
4. Click the **Internet** icon.
5. Click **Default Level**.
6. Click **Apply**.
7. Click **OK**. The PassMark server is now on the list of sites from which Internet Explorer will accept cookies.

Mozilla Firefox

To allow PassMark server cookies in Firefox v1.5 and v2.0:

1. On the Tools menu, click **Options**. The Options dialog box opens.
2. Click the **Privacy** icon.
3. In the Cookies area, click **Exceptions**. The Exceptions – Cookies dialog box appears.
4. In the **Address of web site** box, type the address of the PassMark website.
5. Click **Allow**.
6. Click **Close**. The Options dialog box re-appears.
7. Click **OK**. The PassMark website is added to the list of sites from which Firefox will accept cookies.

Apple Safari

To allow PassMark server cookies in Safari v2.0:

1. In the top menu bar, open the Safari menu.
2. Click **Preferences**.
3. Click the **Security** icon.
4. In the Accept Cookies area, click **Always**.
5. Close the window. Safari will now accept cookies from the PassMark website.

These instructions are intended to be simple, effective and appropriate for most users. Sophisticated users need only know that their settings must allow a First-Party cookie from our domain: lbsfcu.org. Blocking or deleting our cookie will prevent the security system from registering your computer and its location. Every time you log on to CU OnLine, you will be required to repeat the setup process.
